noble person, Bullseye and hi-fi."


"Name a bracket maker and a racket maker."

"That's easy, nurd nose. Name a super durable quality race bike."

The Supergoose holds the number two spot in the mighty, illuminous, and seemingly endless gaggle of Goose gigglers. The Super is a virtual duplicate of the factory race bike, the Team Mongoose, but is

about fifty bucks cheaper for econobuckaroos. The extra fifty smackers buys you an aluminum alloy crank set and a suede Pro saddle.

Both models use the same frame—only the finish is different. The Team comes epoxy painted, either red or blue, while the Super is show-chromed with red or blue accessories.

Number three in the Goose lineup is the vividly venerable Mongoose. Its frame has the same geometry, however mild steel tubing rather than chrome-moly is used for the rear triangle.

The Mongoose comes in four variations—the freewheeler Mongoose II, the Motomag wheeled Freemag, the coaster braked Motomag, and the Mongoose Wire

Specialty machines include: the Mosegoose, a 20-inch machine for super ganglies. The Minigoose,

a scaled down 20-incher. The 16-inch Mitygoose. The Kos Kruiser, a 26-inch racing cruiser. Got that? There'll be a test later. No multiple choice, just a 300-word essay on Mother Goose and Father Christmas.

For a while there, Is and IIs kinda obfuscated or even clouded the Supergoose choosing. The roman numerals identified the finish: I—nickel and II—chrome. Now there's just a single chrome-finished Supergoose.

Besides the nickel to chrome switch, the Super has also seen a

seat swap and a move from blackwall to skinwall tires.

GOOSE GEOMETRY

The basic Goose lengths and angles remain unchanged while continuous testing efforts look for even more magic numbers. The most recent prototypes have used modified rear stay dropouts that raise the bottom bracket slightly.

The Mongoose frame offers one of the lowest center-of-gravity measurements on the market. The lower the CG, the more stable a bike will feel in corners, all other

things being equal. A higher CG causes a bike to feel "floppier" or less precise when leaned over. Most bike builders settle for a happy medium. The trick is to go low enough to improve stability, without going so low that the pedals scrape too easily.




